PHOTOGRAPHY LESSON GUIDE OUTLINE

This photography guide is intended to be used by teachers as an introduction to photography. It can be adapted for use with Elementary, Middle or High School classes.

To use this kit the teacher needs to prepare a projector and a set of digital cameras.

Each lesson is divided in 4 key areas:

- Composition
- Perspective
- Elements & principles of art
- Subject matter

We recommend allowing 1 hour for each. This will allow students to develop their understanding of photography and to develop their skills.

Each key area follows 4 steps:

- **Understand**: Introduce the key knowledge and terminology (10 minutes)
- **Observe & Analyse**: view and discuss the selected imagery, using the discussion questions to guide deeper analysis. This might be done in small groups or as a class, with the images printed, projected, or viewed on a device such as an ipad (15 minutes)
- **Create**! Students apply their knowledge in a simple activity (20 minutes)
- **Evaluate and conclude**: finish the lesson with small-group discussions using the evaluation questions to guide deeper thinking and summarise the learning (10 minutes)

When time is limited (1 or 2 sessions)

- Select 3 or 4 photographs from the slides
- Arrange students in small groups to view and discuss the images.
- Use the poster to guide students' discussions of the four key areas of knowledge,
- Encourage them to consider the question: What are the qualities of a successful, interesting and meaningful photograph?

Suggestions for leading an effective art investigation:

- Encourage all students to share their ideas, interpretations and questions
- Encourage diverse interpretations of artworks by acknowledging the validity of all responses
- Encourage students to support their responses with evidence from the image. Follow up with questions, such as: What do you see that makes you say that?
- Use extended wait times to allow students ample opportunity to examine and think about the artwork. Silence means students are still thinking.
